# **JURIS DOCTOR (JD)**

### **Overview**

The Juris Doctor degree at Miami Law is a full-time program combining a rigorous academic curriculum with professional training in critical lawyering skills. The 88-credit degree program is a full-time program requiring three academic years of study.

### **Admission Requirements**

To be considered for admission to University of Miami School of Law, an applicant must have earned a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university prior to enrolling at the School of Law. The Law School admits first-year J.D. students to commence studies **only in the fall semester** and **reviews applications on a rolling basis throughout the year**. Applications are reviewed as soon as all required documents are received.
