

# MINOR IN GLOBAL HEALTH

## Overview

The undergraduate minor in Global Health (GHS) is designed for students who have an interest in the interdisciplinary perspectives of global health but may not have the flexibility to pursue a major.

The minor requires 15 credits and is ideal for students who wish to understand how issues surrounding global health relate to the greater impacts on society, culture, and the environment.
